
EN303 English Literature

Objectives:

- Read assignments closely and comprehensively and to rephrase ideas in original ways.
- Use vocabulary, historical references, and literary terms correctly.
- Write thoughtful literary responses to assigned reading.

• **35% Quizzes**. There will be several quizzes over assigned reading, terms (vocabulary and literary), historical events, and any topics covered during class lectures, videos, discussions, etc.

Grading Criteria:

- **30% Final**. The final will be accumulative, i.e. covering all material covered throughout the semester. There will not be a midterm.
- 35% Written Assignments. Students will be expected to write several short but insightful papers that demonstrate both comprehension and contemplation of the assigned text.
