Class Structure and Policies:

- Homework—Every Thursday two homework assignments will be due. The first homework sheet will be a
 Word Studies worksheet (including work on spelling, stems, and diction). The second homework sheet will be
 Grammar homework (covering topics gone over in class, as well as reading and memorization drills). Please
 print out copies of both assignments, do them, and bring them to class on Thursday.
- Quizzes/Tests—A quiz or test will be given every week that class meets. Tests may be made up in the office within two weeks. Quizzes may not be made up. Missed quizzes will not affect your grade.
- Writing Journals will be due every Friday and collected at the instructor's discretion. Entries will be handwritten in your composition book. This writing is to get you comfortable expressing your ideas and will only be graded on a done/not done basis.
- All assignments must be turned in at or before the beginning of the class hour on the due date. <u>Assignments are due whether or not you attend class</u>. If you will miss a class, please send in your assignment with a buddy or put it in my in-box in the copy room **before** it is due. Assignments turned in up to one week late will be docked 10%. After one week, the assignment may not be turned in for credit.
